## **What is Ayurveda?**

Ayurveda (pronounced eye-yur-vayda) is a word from the Sanskrit language, literally meaning the 'science or knowledge of life'. Ayurveda is a study of all facets of life from infancy through to old age. Ayurveda is a health science, which has been recognised by the World Health Organisation. In India the highly regarded Ayurvedic degree course (B.A.M.S) takes up to 6 years to complete and involves traditional and contemporary medical subjects ranging from Herbal Medicine to Ayurvedic Surgery to Gerontology (the study of ageing and life extension).

Ayurveda, with its holistic focus on health, is now being sought after outside of its home in India, from countries such as Holland and Russia to the USA, Japan and Australia. The study of Ayurveda holds much appeal for those interested in Health studies, because it fills the gaps and expands the range of health assessment and therapeutic means available to our current health care system. Moreover, Ayurveda is a science allied to and emanating from Vedic learning which seeks to assure the fulfillment of all aims in life. Ayurveda is an enlightened approach to health.

## **What is an Ayurvedic Lifestyle Consultant?**

In Australia, the Ayurvedic Lifestyle Consultant Program is nationally recognised as a Certificate 4 training course (National course code HLT41207). The Ayurvedic Lifestyle Consultant will spend a period of 18 months studying the philosophy and practical assessment and therapeutic methods of Ayurveda.

Students learn how to assess the constitutional body type (Prakriti), psychological profile and current health status (Vikriti) of an individual according to traditional Ayurvedic medicine.

The students will also be trained to provide therapeutic regimes to restore balance to their clients through the use of herbs, meditation, nutrition, lifestyle counseling, daily and seasonal routines, Ayurvedic massage, Shirodhara therapy, Kati Basti therapy and Ayurvedic cooking.

Ayurvedic Lifestyle Consultants have the opportunity, once qualified, to take on further training through the AIAS Advanced Diploma in Ayurveda (National course code HLT60707).

#### **Ayurvedic Doctor – A Brief introduction**

**Ayurveda doctor/ Ayurvedacharya** or Vaidya is a term used for those persons who have earned their bachelor degree in Ayurvedic medicine and surgery (BAMS). This degree in traditional medicine is, unlike those in many parts of the world, the hardest to come by and is equivalent in duration and curriculum to allopathic or the modern medicine degree in India.

Entrance into the BAMS course in Ayurveda is available to students with the required pre-requisites in physics, chemistry, zoology and botany who must then pass the State entrance examination, the **Combined Premedical Test**.

After 1961-62, the BAMS was **converted into a degree** while the course duration remained same. The syllabus and curriculum has been standardised by the Central Council of Indian Medicine. The BAMS degree is now awarded by a University.

The Central Council of Indian Medicine (CCIM)) is the official body responsible for recognizing all bona fide degree holders in Ayurveda and Schools of Ayurvedic learning. CCIM plays a very significant role much like the AMA and ANTA or ATMS here in Australia do for Allopathic and Natural Medicine respectively. The public can then be assured that when they consult with an Ayurvedic Doctor recognized by CCIM that they are consulting with an authentic, reputable and properly trained Ayurvedic professional. Students of Ayurveda must also seek the same level of training and standards for any teacher of Ayurveda outside of India.

### **Dr S. Ajit (AIAS Founder)**

Dr S Ajit, BAMS, PCAS, is an Ayurvedacharya, a graduate of the Government Ayurvedic Medical College, University of Patiala, from North India.

Dr Ajit is a leader in the field of Ayurveda outside of India, where he has campaigned tirelessly in an effort to create high standards in the learning of Ayurveda.

In India Dr Ajit worked as an Ayurvedic panchkarma doctor, lecturer at different Ayurveda Colleges, and was also a permanent employee of the Government of India as an Ayurvedic Medical Officer (no. AY E11-pb-80/100).

### **How it works:**

- **Registration:** Students need to fill the AIAS Registration form and send it to **PO Box 4010, Eight Mile Plains, Queensland, 4113 Australia.**
- AIAS will send you a receipt for your registration payment, the student manual, induction form and official enrollment form. Please read the student manual, sign the induction checklist form, fill out the enrollment form and return to AIAS with your course fees.
- **Student Manual:** Student manual includes detailed explanation for competency standards, what you need for the course, services to the students, standards for course work, training and assessments and AIAS policies and procedures. Once enrolled, student will receive Student manual. We encourage students to go through it and ask questions to clear their doubts. Students need to sign the “Induction Form” and send it back to the Institute.
- **Welcome Pack:** You will now be sent your welcome pack that includes registration number, Modules CD (a data CD containing PDF files of course modules and assignments), Audio CDs, guidelines for study, list of text books etc. The AIAS student registration number will be issued by the Institute.
- **Guidelines:** Students will receive a set of guidelines to start their studies. It will includes which modules starts first, how to understand and how to do the assignment which is given at the end of the module.
- **Course structure:** A list of subjects is given below. Please visit the website <http://aiasinstitute.com/clinical-ayurvedic-lifestyle-con#Distance> to know more about course. You will find list of subjects. The whole course is divided into two categories The Ayurvedic modules and non Ayurvedic modules. The Ayurvedic modules will be provided by the institute along with audio and text CD’s and their practical part will be covered in the 15 days In-house training. Students will interact with the teacher through online video conferencing. The non Ayurvedic modules are mandatory and students will be responsible to complete through a Registered Training Organisation during their Ayurvedic studies. A student needs to submit their certificates for mandatory papers in order to obtain Ayurvedic certificate from AIAS. Non Ayurvedic components must be undertaken through a Recognised Training Organisation (RTO).
- **Online interactive sessions/Video Conferencing:** The video conferencing will be once a month. Once the student enrolled and pay their fees, the online sessions will start after one month. Students will receive time and dates for the video conferencing. They will receive email a week prior to the interactive session along with topic name. We encourage our students to participate these sessions to get more and more benefit of this facility.
- **Assignments:** Students will complete their assignment at the end of every module and send it to the teacher. Please go through the guidelines to know how to do it. They need to spend at least 14 hrs per week study at their places that will help them

to learn and understand Ayurvedic principles. This will be beneficial for them to complete the course in time.

- **In-house Practical Training:** On completion of at least first 10 modules, students will be eligible for Practical training. This is one of the most popular and important programs of AIAS. ### **What kind of assistance can I expect?**

Once enrolled, students will get their study pack that includes module notes (on CD) & audio CDs of the lectures given by Dr. Ajit. The audio CDs are in a class room format so that students can listen to Dr. Ajit in the same way as the face to face students as well as hearing some of the classroom discussion. You will receive the complete detail pack explaining how to start the course.

However, recognizing that this is sometimes difficult the Australasian Institute of Ayurvedic Studies has structured the programme in such a way to enhance your distance learning experience:

- All the practical subjects are offered in a 15 day intensive in house programme at the Institute's Centre in Auckland, New Zealand, providing valuable contact between teacher & student (Only available after completion of first 10 study modules).

**Final Test:** Three hour final test will be held after completion of all the modules, assignments and In-House Training. This will be taken at your own place under the supervision of JP. (To appear in the final exam students must have attended all the weekend sessions as well as 15 days in house training and must have completed all the written assignments and unsupervised practical work – additional areas of study for the Certificate 4 may be completed after the exam including Anatomy and physiology, OH and S and Infection Control and Senior First Aid)).

### **All course study material will be supplied on a CD in a printable format.**

Students are required to have Internet access and an email account. This will help you to interact with your teacher through video conferencing as well as this will allow easier communication for and between all students and assist in the creation of student study. Students in remote regions will feel more closely connected. Dr Ajit may be contacted whenever you have questions related specifically to you course modules and assignments. Please do not expect unscheduled health consultations for free over the internet in fairness to Dr Ajit and Ayurveda.

**Eligibility:** The candidates who are keen to learn Ayurveda and committed to themselves for study.

**Intake:** Feb and July every year

**Duration:** The duration to finish the course is 18 - 20 months. We encourage students to complete the course by this time. The maximum limit to complete the course is 36 months. If any student feels difficulty in completing the course by this time, we have deferment policy under which students can apply for extension. **Refund Policies**

You will have been given a copy of the Refund Policy with your enrolment pack, but the major provisions are listed below to assist you in the event that you withdraw from the course outside of the cooling off period.

All monies received are placed in a separate trust account and are not accessed until the course commences. A relevant proportion of the fees paid will remain in that account until the course is completed.

A fourteen (14) day cooling off period shall apply for all enrolments, unless the student commences attendance classes or distance education studies (as verified by the submission of coursework or assessments) within that period. A student who does so is deemed to have made a firm contract to undertake training with AIAS and any withdrawal from classes or training shall operate as detailed in the Refund Policy.

In the case of a distance education student, this cooling off period is counted from the day they get their first pack of modules. Students must show the proof of the date they receive their modules pack. If student will unable to present the proof, the cooling off period is counted from the day AIAS sent their module pack.

Students requiring a full refund must return all relevant documentation (**in good order, with the original receipt**), within the fourteen (14) day cooling off period. No refund

can be made on any distance education study module or workbook which has been partially completed by a student.

Students who wish to withdraw from the course after 14 days, due to unavoidable circumstances are able to request deferment of their studies to a future course providing. In these circumstances, their fees, or such unused portion of fees that apply, held in the separate trust account until such time as the deferred studies commence

At no circumstances is a refund given after the fourteen (14) day cooling off period. AIAS may, at its discretion, apply an administrative charge for processing applications for refunds and deferments. A fee of \$250 will apply upon re-enrolment when deferring.

All disputes on refunds shall be addressed by application of *STU-POL-008 Complaints and Appeals Policy and Procedures* and shall be referred to Consumer Affairs arbitration if not able to be satisfactorily resolved by negotiation between the student and the school.

### **Academic Regulations Policies**

Pre-requisites and co-requisites for the courses: These are as set in the qualifications framework and under the Units of Competency. Some sections of the course are designed to be pre-requisite or co-requisite and you should follow the guidance of the administration in this regard.

**Entry requirements:** Although there are no formal prerequisites for the first year programme, some prior knowledge or study of Ayurveda will greatly enhance the understanding and comprehension of the programme material. Preference will be given to those, who are dedicated and sincere in learning Ayurvedic science.

### **Units of Competency**

In order to be awarded a Statement of Attainment for a unit of competency, all components of the unit must be satisfactorily completed in order for a judgment of competence to be made.

### **Qualification**

In order to be awarded a Certificate or Advanced Diploma, all Units of Competency listed for the qualification must be satisfactorily completed before the qualification can be signed off.

### **Home Study requirements**

The distance learning students will need to do at least 28 hours home study per module. This commencement needs to begin from the day you receive your study pack.

Mutual recognition of qualifications issued by other RTO s

If you have attained any Units of Competency listed for the course you are undertaking with us, you are able to gain immediate credit.

These qualifications or Statements should bear one of these statements:

If you are supplying the evidence of this through a photocopy of the original, the photocopy must be notarised as a true and exact copy by a Justice of the Peace.

### **Recognition of Prior Learning**

The process of RPL depends on the evidence you provide that matches the Units of Competency.

#### **This evidence must be:**

**Valid:** it must match the competencies as set out in the RPL manuals

**Authentic:** it must be clearly identifiable as evidence that relates to you

**Sufficient:** enough evidence must be supplied, in great enough depth to allow for accurate assessment

**Current:** generally, evidence must be related to skills and knowledge gained in the past five years, although this may be less critical when applied to traditional and cultural academic content. In all cases, you should be guided by the information provided by our specialist assessors. More details on the RPL process are given in the RPL manuals. A form enabling you to request a manual accompanies the enrolment form.

**Note: No status can be awarded for part competencies and you must demonstrate competency against the full standard in order for RPL to apply.**

### **Leaving the course early**

A **Statement of Attendance** is able to be provided for the satisfactory completion of any practical workshop, retreat or seminar which forms an underpinning component of the requirement for a Unit of Competency, but not the full Unit of Competency.

A **Statement of Attainment** is able to be issued when a Student completes all the requirements for a specified Unit of Competency in accordance with DETA Australia.

A **Qualification** when all the aggregate components of a qualification are attained, the student will be issued with a Certificate IV or Advanced Diploma as detailed in the Training Package and under DETA

If you wish to leave a course before completing any component which would lead to the issue of any of the above qualifications, you should discuss this with the AIAS and also obtain advice on deferment of studies, the implications for refunds and other relevant student issues.

## **Assessment**

Units of Competency may be assessed in different ways:

- As written or verbal testing to ensure that you understand the underlying concepts for your therapy
- By completion of written assignments and Home Study Programme workbooks
- By practical demonstrations of competencies in workshops, intensives and industry placements
- By formal on-the-job assessment in specific instances
- By RPL processes all assessments are conducted as a means for you to improve your own performance over time. Practical assessments are designed to mirror industry working conditions and cover:
  - Skills required performing the therapy/ task
  - Client contact skills
  - Occupational health and safety
  - Checking for understanding of required knowledge
